

Animal Sculptures: FSE

- Throughout history animals have been an important part in our lives.



Step 1: Sketch

- Create a sketch or sketches of your animal
- **It has to be coloured and detailed**
 - Think about:
 - Colours
 - Textures
 - Line-work/Design/Patterns
 - Shape

Thinking

15 Marks

- Does the sketch show value? Colour? Texture?
- Does the artist show planning?

Step 2: Creation

- With teacher approval, you will start and create your animal using a variety of materials.
- Using tape, you will have to piece together your animal slowly.
- Think about what you need and what materials can make those parts.
 - Tubes for legs, trunk, horn
 - Newspaper shaped into balls
 - Egg cartons for legs, paws, etc...
- Once your animal is put together then you can move onto step 3.

Knowledge

15 Marks

- Apply design process to produce a work of art
- Select tools, materials, processes, and technologies for art production & use them safely and properly.

Application

60 Marks

- Demonstrate an understanding of design process and creative process
- Apply the elements of design to your work: Line, Shape, Form, Value, Texture, Space, and Colour
- Organization & presentation of artwork
- Demonstrate problem solving skills.

Step 3: Papier Mache

- Using the flour & water mixture that the teacher has set out you will put 3-4 layers of papier mache onto your animal
 - You will take strips of newspaper and dip them into the mache mix and whip off any excess and then wrap it around your animal
 - You will apply this onto every section of the animal.
 - Use small pieces and medium sizes pieces
 - Each night it will dry, allowing you to apply

Step 4: Final Touches

- When your animal is dry and you all areas are hard you will paint it. Choose colour that your animal looks like.
- Some colours need a few coats, a good idea is to add white for the first coat {red, orange, yellow}
- After painting you will glue on whatever textures you'd like to use
 - Your animal might look different from your original sketch – it's ok.

Step 5: Writing 10 marks

- Objects carry stories; you will create a story about your animal.
 - Maybe someone found it and took it home?
 - Maybe it's a toy and it comes alive under the full moon.
 - Maybe in your story people worship the animal?
 - Maybe it was made for a special event?



- Must be 6 postcard sizes long. Each postcard needs to have writing. It can be longer if needed.

Option 1: Story Book

- Creation your story as a Story Book.
- You may use the postcards or choose to create a book by folding three papers in half

Option 2: Comic Book

- Create your story as a comic strip using 6 postcards
- Each postcard must have written information on it.
