

Letter Creation:



- What is your favourite letter? A, G, X?
- You will be choosing a letter and decorating it creatively. Think about what the letter means to you, and think about the design you want to create.
- You will be marked according to your craftsmanship of the letter and the fine arts quality in the design.

1	Pick your letter, and sketch it out according to the size of the paper you will use for your stencil.
2	Once you are happy with the way your letter has taken shape, cut the letter out of the paper and use your letter as a stencil on your Bristol board.
3	Place the stencil letter in a position on top of the Bristol board so you can fit the letter twice – you will be cutting out two letters in the end; one for the front, and one for the back.
4	Choose one of your cutout letters and place it on your desk. Take the cut cardboard tubes and place them throughout your letter. Fill the whole area, including small areas in which you can use half of a tube or create a fold with Bristol board to fill the spot. Once complete dip them lightly into the glue container and then place them back onto your letter.
5	Next glue the top of the paper cups to the top of the letter. You will have to use a popsicle stick.
6	When both top and bottom are glued really well, we will take gummed tape and tape all of the edges of the objects. You must overlap in order to cover the area you just applied and the top and bottom.
7	When the sides are all well secured, we will use recycled/scrap white paper and paper mache this on top. For it to have a uniform finish and make this sculpture thicker for better support.
8	When the paper mache is completely dry we will decorate it with paint, paper, and other embellishments (sparkles, material, string etc...)
